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# Introduction and Background

This Neighborhood Portrait data profile was prepared by Data You Can Use with the support of Urban Economic Development Association of Wisconsin (UEDA). The framework is based on input and advice from community organizers working in the neighborhoods supported by Milwaukee's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. The original set of neighborhood portraits were released by Data You Can Use in 2016 using 2010-2014 American Community Survey 5-year estimates. This document is part of the first update to those original Neighborhood Portraits and has been edited in response to community feedback following the release and use of the original portraits.

Data You Can Use and our partners hope that these tables continue to be used by those working in Milwaukee neighborhoods in their work planning, organizing, and funding development work and programing. It is designed to be used with their staff, their partners, their funders, their elected officials, and the residents of their neighborhoods, and can be used to supplement and support the stories and anecdotes of residents to build a case for needed resources, and to identify more questions.

As part of the release of the updated Neighborhood Portraits, related training on the use of census data was conducted and offered to the neighborhood partners. A final draft of each Portrait was reviewed by these same partners, and neighborhood organizers shared the ideas, stories, and strategies that they derived from the data.

With each update to the Neighborhood Portraits, Data You Can Use strives to provide both timely data and improvements to the way data is displayed and/or the topics covered. Longer-term plans include the possibility of an interactive way to access neighborhood data, looking at some of the data points over time, and adding additional topics to the Portraits. # About the Data and Acknowledgements

#### **Data Sources**

This data portrait uses data from the 2016-2020 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates, which was the most up-to-date data at the time of the writing of this report. Specific source tables from the ACS are cited below each table within this report.

Census tracts 3.02, 3.03, and 5.02 were used to define the Little Menomonee River Parkway (NSP 19) neighborhood for the purposes of this report. These tracts were chosen based on Neighborhood Strategic Planning Area (NSP) boundaries and in consultation with our neighborhood partners. The tables in the report describe the population that live within these census tracts. Please note that the boundaries of these tracts may differ from neighborhood or NSP boundaries.

#### **Data Quality and Reliability**

The data found in this report is from the American Community Survey and is some of the best data available that describes the people, households, families, and housing in Milwaukee neighborhoods. The American Community Survey data is collected by the U.S. Census Bureau, which holds its data to high standards.

It is also important to note that numbers and percentages included in this report are considered estimates. This is because the Census Bureau uses a sample of the population when they conduct the survey, which creates some level of uncertainty. The data presented here have a margin of error associated with each data point, which is a measure of the possible variation of the estimate and the true population value of each number. The margin of error helps data users understand the reliability of each data point.

We have chosen not to include margin of error for the estimates in the tables below so that the tables are clearer and easier to use. If you would like more information about data reliability for the tables in this report or would like to know the margin of error for a particular estimate, please reach out to our team at Data You Can Use. #### How to interpret this table

The Census Bureau defines a family as "a group of two people or more (one of whom is the householder) related by birth, marriage, or adoption and residing together; all such people (including related subfamily members) are considered as members of one family."

- One third (33%) of households in Little Menomonee River Parkway are headed by women with no spouse present, compared to 21% in the City of Milwaukee as a whole.
- Under one quarter (23%) of households in in Little Menomonee River Parkway are occupied by individuals living alone, less than the rate for the City of Milwaukee (37%).
- The estimated average household size in Little Menomonee River Parkway neighborhood is 3.07 people per household, which is higher than the average household size for the City of Milwaukee as a whole (2.51).

#### How to interpret this table

- The **labor force participation rate** refers to the proportion of the population age 20-64 that is either working or actively looking for work.
- The **employment/population ratio** is the proportion of the population age 20-64 that is working.
- **Unemployment rate** is the percentage of those in the labor force who are not working.
- In this table, **not working** refers to the combined percentage of people who are not in the labor force and those who are in the labor force but are unemployed.

- More than three quarters (78%) of female Little Menomonee River Parkway residents ages 20-64 are participating in the labor force by working or actively looking for work, a greater percentage than in the City of Milwaukee (74%).
- 8% of the labor force in Little Menomonee River Parkway is unemployed and looking for work, a slightly greater rate than in the City of Milwaukee as a whole (6%).

- Of the owner-occupied housing units in the Little Menomonee River Parkway, one fifth (81%) are single family homes, compared to 76% in the City of Milwaukee.
- 16% of the renters in Little Menomonee River Parkway live in single family attached homes (such as town houses), compared to 5% of renters in the city overall.
- The greatest percentage of renters in the City of Milwaukee live in buildings with 10 or more apartments (29%), compared to only 13% in Little Menomonee River Parkway.

- Of the housing units in Little Menomonee River Parkway, less than one third (31%) are two-bedroom units, compared to only a third in the City of Milwaukee as a whole (33%).
- 4% of the housing units in Little Menomonee River Parkway have only one bedroom, compared with 16% in the City of Milwaukee overall.
- Of all the housing units in Little Menomonee River Parkway, only 7% were built in 1939 or earlier, compared to 38% in the city overall.
- 69% of the housing in Little Menomonee River Parkway was built between 1950 and 1979.

- 39% of all owner-occupied units with a mortgage in the Little Menomonee River Parkway neighborhood pay 30 percent or more of their household income towards housing costs, a higher percentage than the City of Milwaukee as a whole (32%).
- Almost a quarter (24%) of all owner-occupied units with a mortgage in the Little Menomonee River Parkway neighborhood pay less than 20 percent of their household income towards housing costs, a lower percentage than the City of Milwaukee as a whole (41%).
